BCH counsellors draw on a broad range of approaches and frameworks including traumainformed feminist approaches to assess needs, develop therapeutic care plans, provide counselling, and evaluate outcomes.

Principal Areas of Responsibility	 Undertake assessments, planning, counselling, and progress evaluation with victim/survivors of family violence using feminist and trauma lenses, in a manner that is equitable, empowering and culturally relevant. Undertake family violence risk assessments and make referrals as required using the MARAM framework. Provide an initial assessment, referrals as required, and counselling to children, individuals, couples, families, and groups. Provide short term counselling for EAP, Options for pregnancy, support after suicide and crisis within the workplace when requested. Provide support and advocacy for individuals and/or families who require assistance accessing appropriate services. Monitor, evaluate and review progress and the counselling plan regularly. Participate in joint case management with other agencies and service providers when appropriate. Provide secondary consultation when required. Maintain professional case notes and undertake administrative duties as required by the role. Data reporting and report writing may be required at times. Participate in the planning, implementation, and evaluation of group work or other special projects in collaboration with colleagues, team members and/or internal or external programs and services. Engage in health promotion activities such as service promotion or community education within a range of internal and external programs and events when required. Participate in regular individual and peer supervision. Participate in regular team meetings.
